




Thursday 26th March 2020: Billie Liar (1963)

'Kitchen-sink' comedy drama set in Bradford, scripted by Keith Waterhouse from his own novel. Sensitively directed by John Schlesinger, it stars Tom Courtenay, Julie Christie, Mona Washbourne, Leonard Rossiter & Wilfred Pickles. One of the most memorable and universally acclaimed films of the 60s, it's listed as one of the British Film Institute's Top 100 British films. [94 mins, B&W, PG certificate]



Friday 27th March: Blinded by the Light (2019)

"The feel-good movie of the year": a 'coming-of-age' story about a British-Pakistani Muslim teenager in Luton in 1987. Directed by Gurinder Chadha (Bend It Like Beckham & Viceroy's House), it's a comedy-drama inspired by the life of a journalist and his love of the works of American rock star Bruce Springsteen. "Like a life-affirming rock anthem, [it] hits familiar chords with confidence & flair... building to a conclusion that leaves audiences cheering for an encore." [112 mins, 12 certificate]
